Focus on the Readings

Palm Sunday's Mass contains four readings and the psalm. The first, a Gospel, relates to Palm Sunday's remembrance of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. This year we proclaim Matthew's account which emphasises the fulfilment of the Hebrew scriptures and the reference to "Son of David". These elements are constantly recalled in this Gospel; remember the Gospel of Matthew is the only one that includes the visit of the Wise Men from the East with their royal and godly gifts. The first reading from the prophet Isaiah and the second reading are read every year (see left column).

The Reading of the Passion is lengthy and designed in the lectionary to be read in parts: Narrator, Jesus, Other dialogues and the Crowd in which the whole congregation may participate. Again Matthew's version is rich with quotes from the psalms and prophets.

"He is writing to believers in a doctrinal and quasi-liturgical style. He offers Christ's disciples some keys to understanding the passion. He wants to introduce his readers to the Christian understanding of the disconcerting events that led their Master and Lord to die on the cross. Thus by sharing the faith of the church they will be able to see the cross in the coherent whole of the divine salvation." (Days of the Lord v2 p225)

Mystery of Christ

The Second Reading this Sunday is noted as a hymn about Christ. Paul, writing to the Philippians, includes this very early Christian hymn. The text both reminds them of the humility and suffering of Christ but also of his victory over death and his glory. It is now a hymn for us to sing of our salvation that reaches out to everyone.

Christ reverses the sin of Adam. Adam sought to be god-like, Christ emptied himself to be a human being. But God raised him high so now Christ may raise up all. There is a strong connection with this hymn and the four servant songs in Isaiah.

Pope Francis Message for Lent 2023 (continued)

Here is the second proposal for this Lent: do not take refuge in a religiosity made up of extraordinary events and dramatic experiences, out of fear of facing reality and its daily struggles, its hardships and contradictions. The light that Jesus shows the disciples is an anticipation of Easter glory, and that must be the goal of our own journey, as we follow "him alone". Lent leads to Easter: the "retreat" is not an end in itself, but a means of preparing us to experience the Lord's passion and cross with faith, hope and love, and thus to arrive at the resurrection

On the Lighter Side The question 'When is Maundy Thursday?' reminds me of an old joke:

Where is the tiger's head? Three feet from his tail!

When is Maundy Thursday? Three days before Easter Sunday!

What is the Christian Life Program (CLP)?
