

Most Holy Trinity Sunday, 7th June 2020

Gospel Reading: JN 3:16-18

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.



Gospel Reflection

Part One of God revealing Himself to Moses is witnessed at the scene of the burning bush when Moses asked God his name (Exodus 3:14-15). Today's first reading may be considered Part Two of God revealing Himself to Moses when God proclaimed "Lord, Lord, a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithful-ness." Again Moses was truck with awe and worshipped Him.

The second reading is the conclusion to the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians: St Paul expresses his affection for his friends, his concern for their well-being and his faith in Christ and God's love and peace for all. These words have become our welcome in the liturgy, reinforcing our proclamation of the Trinity.

Finally the Gospel is both reminiscent of God's revelation of his holy name to Moses and his purpose of his revelation in Christ. As the Exodus reading is considered the "Gospel of the Old Testament, these verses are considered the Gospel in the Gospel in the New Testament.

Easing of Restrictions on Churches (1 June 2020)

As you are probably aware, a wide range of restrictions are being further eased, including on churches, though in most cases the maximum attendance now includes the priest and others directly involved in the liturgy.

In summary, the following is now permitted:

- Liturgies or prayer groups with up to 20 attendees (in addition to celebrant, ministers, door attendant, etc.)
- Funerals with up to 50 attendees (in addition to celebrant and funeral staff)
- Weddings with up to 20 guests (in addition to bride, groom and celebrant) In all cases, the following requirements apply, noting that the register of attendees is no longer required for private worship or brief visits:
- Distancing of at least 1.5m between attendees
- Signage at the church door specifying the maximum number permitted at any time, allowing 4 square metres/person
- •Reasonable time between events to allow for cleaning
- Cleaning by wiping with disinfectant:
 - Frequently touched surfaces (at least twice/day)
 - Whenever a surface is visibly soiled
 - Immediately after a spill
- . A register of attendees, including: first name, phone number, date & time of attendance, except for those who:
 - Attend for private worship; or
 - Attend a support group where confidentiality is typical; or
 - Attend for less than 15 minutes

As from 1 June, the Mass schedule can now include 20 attendees; in addition to celebrant, ministers, door attendant, etc.. To cater for all parishioners the Mass will be 'invitation only' due to number restrictions. At this time, we have tried to call everyone to be included in our rosters.
